The growth rate of Bhutan's urban population was on average 5.7 percent per year from 2000-2010, the highest rate in South Asia

Background

My Gakidh Village is a joint initiative of Bhutan Youth Development & Aide et Action International. It is the first of its kind in Bhutan with the overall goal to curb rural-urban youth migration by providing livelihood skills and opportunities to unemployed youth within their own rural communities.



Activities

- 1. Community-based ecotourism: reviving the heritage trail of the Divine Madman, training local guides, establishing homestays
- 2. Traditional arts and crafts: training in pottery for unemployed youth
- 3. IT literacy and livelihood skills development: established a Media Lab in Thinleygang, conducting relevant trainings
- 4. Purely Organic Products: launched a youth cooperative that harvests and packages purely organic forest tea and red rice

Impact

- •Over 50 youth across 21 villages trained and supported in ecotourism while gaining basic IT literacy and livelihood skills these youth have been empowered to stay in the village for employment or self-employment
- Income generation and increase in household income for unemployed youth and their families
- Increased forest and wildlife conservation as a result of alternative economic incentives for environmental preservation, such as ecotourism
